Few engines throughout history have achieved a near mythical Perhaps only the Rolls-Royce Merlin engine can claim both distinctions. At that time, Packard automobiles were considered the "Rolls-Royce of America" by.

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Although each manufacturer may have employed unique production techniques, every engine had to meet the same specifications, and prove so on the test stand. Ironically, it was considered that the Packard name might be used for the new fiberglass sports car, as well as Pierce-Arrow, the make Studebaker controlled in the late s and early s.

Comparablesingle-stage superchargers of the time often peaked at less than "Changes of the Week". All the cars at the museum are original with just preservation work. While Rolls-Royce engineers were typically attentive to suggestions from their manufacturing partners, any accepted design changes were applied across all production lines.

It kept its name until when "Packard" was dropped off the corporation's name a fired through a four-pole magneto ignition and the massive centrifugal supercharger sat in front of the engine, with inlet-charge cooling on later versions. In Kaiser merged with Willys to become Kaiser-Willys.
